



- ◆ **The PPP Faculty**—several people from the area who get to play and even build pipe organs
- ◆ **A Very Special Guest**—John Schwandt teaches the organ at the University of Oklahoma and plays concerts all over the world. He also improvises (makes stuff up) and accompanies silent movies!
- ◆ **You**—and a bunch of other students like you that are interested in this crazy, mysterious, wonderful musical instrument.

Each student is asked to bring along a piano piece that we can help you play on the organ. All levels of proficiency are welcomed—beginners and up.



What we'll do...

- ◆ **We'll listen**—to people describing how the organ works, and to people making music on the organ
- ◆ **We'll look**—at the insides of organs and find out what you don't see when you're on the outside listening
- ◆ **We'll travel**—to First Lutheran and First Congregational Churches to see those organs
